Participants will look at world societies and the interactions between them. Instruction may cover such topics as: international relations theory, foreign policy analysis, and international law and organization. Students will participate in comparative studies of specific countries and regions and the theory and practice of diplomacy.</li> <li>▪ <b>Elective: Introduction to Economics-</b> In this world, resources are typically scarce but the wants and needs of the population are boundless. The responsibility for figuring out how to best allocate these resources falls into the hands of those who study economics. Participants will focus on the systematic study of the production, conservation, and allocation of resources.
